"Sunny" was one of the first men of the College to give his life for his country. After graduating from Franklin "Sunny" entered Chicago University for his B.D. degree. During his College career he stood out very prominently as a scholar, athlete and social leader. He was always ready to help the man who was in trouble and always made things cheerful. On the Gospel Team "Sunny" was an active leader. When war was declared he was among the first to enlist later winning a commission as 2nd Lieutenant.

A BIT OF HISTORY.

Phi Alpha Pi fraternity was founded at Franklin College, October 30, 1909. For two years previous to this time, however, there had existed among the men of the Independent Literary Societies an organization whose purpose was the promotion of social and political welfare. As this club grew and flourished it was a force to be reckoned with in every phase of College Life.

Believing that a great deal of good could be accomplished the members of the club began preparations to form a Greek letter organization. On October 30, 1909 Phi Alpha Pi was announced and began its present career. The charter members numbered sixteen and in their organization they had in mind especially high ideals in morality and scholarship. These two elements of character have constituted the standards set by the members of Phi Alpha Pi and it is the ambition of all as a body to keep pace with the varied advances of the College.

At the present time the chapter has a membership of twenty men of whom three will be lost by graduation. It is the will of the fraternity to live for quality and not for quantity. The War broke into the plans of the fraternity to the extent that it lost some of its prominent members but is climbing the ladder in spite of the fact.

The members are leaders in all the legitimate phases of College Life. They have taken a prominent part in all forms of athletic, social and religious work. Their standing in the class room is commendable and it is "Consistent Advancement" that is really the watchword of Phi Alpha Pi.

IDEALS OF PHI ALPHA PI.

From the time that Phi Alpha Pi was organized its men have had as their ideal a well rounded life. In an organized way its members have helped each other in every manner that they could, first of all to live a clean life, second to become well developed intellectually and finally to become social leaders.

Many practices indulged in by College men which prevent the highest moral development and efficiency have been most vigorously opposed by the members of Phi Alpha Pi. We can say, frankly, that the ancient motto and ideal of Franklin College " Christianity and Culture " is ours as well.

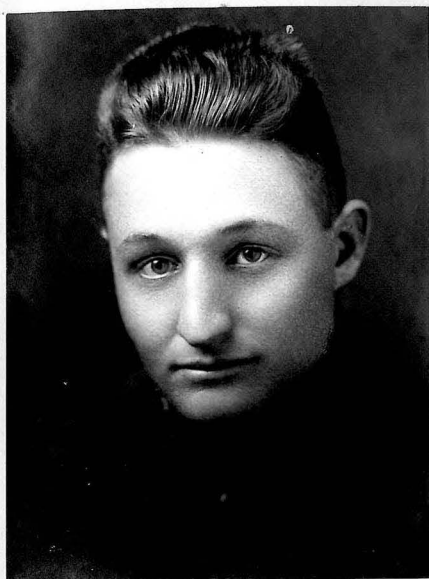

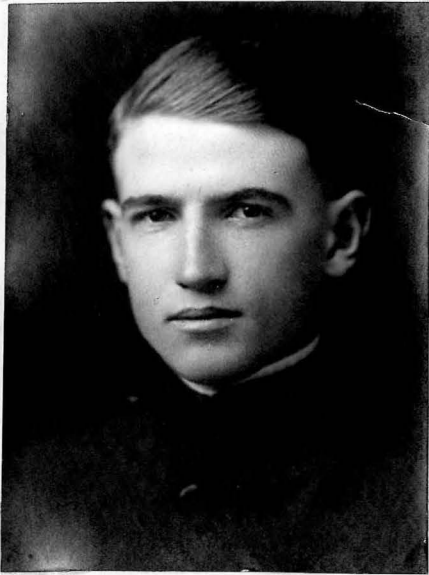
LEONARD RAY TOMLINSON '19.

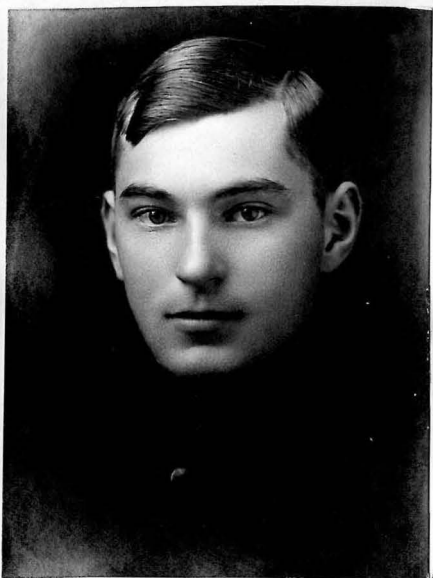
WILLIE KINGSOLVER '21.

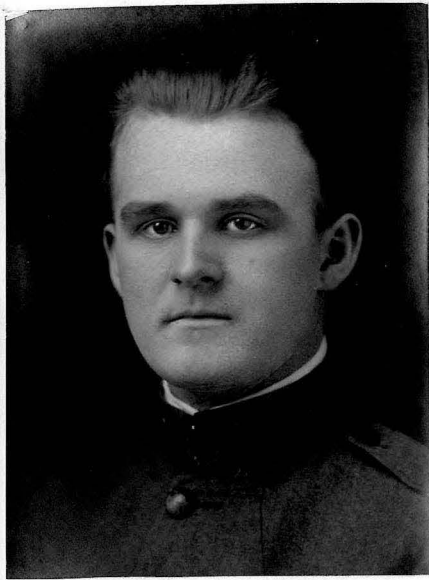
HERMAN MAURICE HAYES '21.

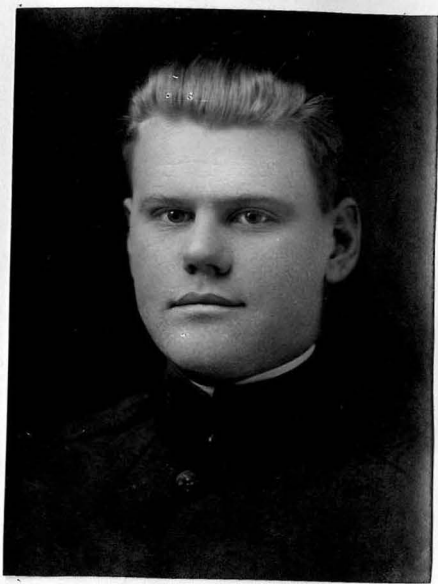
JAMES ROBERT HANDLEY '22.

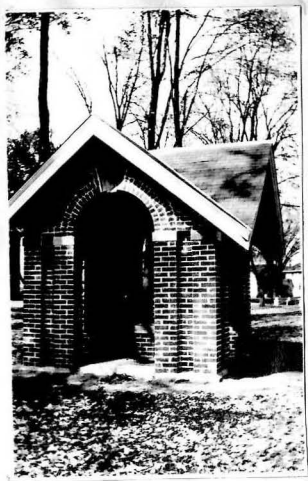


HUGO MONROE GALE '22.
