The Delta Pi Fraternity does hereby solemnly pray and petition that she be granted a charter in Kappa Delta Rho Fraternity.

The Fraternity of Kappa Delta Rho has established ideals that are worthy and high, and conducive to the establishment of a distinctive fraternity of men. The principles which have guided Delta Pi Fraternity have been fundamentally identical with those principles which Kappa Delta Rho Fraternity has recognized. Delta Pi realizes that fraternization with a national organization embodying these principles would be a source of added strength and stability; a source of inspiration for increased zeal and loyalty in the fulfillment of these ideals. It is with this conviction that Delta Pi Fraternity addresses this prayer to Kappa Delta Rho Fraternity, with the sincere hope that it will be favorably received.

The University of Illinois, located at Urbana, Illinois, was founded as a state institution in 1867. It has a present undergraduate enrollemnt of 7400 and a faculty membership of 980. It comprises colleges of Liberal Arts & Science, Agriculture, Engineering, Commerce, Education, Music, Law, Medicine, Denistry and Pharmacy. There are 21 Greek letter fraternities, social, honorary and professional represented at the University,

Of these, 52 live in houses, of which about one-half own their own. About one-third of the entire male student body is included in social organizations. The University supports one of the largest student daily papers in the United States, the Daily Illini. In athletics, she has assumed a leadership in the Big Ten Conference, having had the football championship four times in the last seven years, tied one and lost two. Her track team has held the championship almost continuously.

as among the best in the country, that a certain small group of men decided to from a fraternity whose principles were basically different from those of existing organizations.

The object of the founders was to make Delta Pi a real asset to the University and a benefit to its individual members.

Their desire was to incorporate worthy men who should represent their fraternity in the various phases of University life; exerting themselves in behalf of their University and of their brotherhood.

In this organization friends or natural brothers were not considered, the essential jest being the worthiness and manliness of the individual. Ever since, this principle has been observed in the selection of Delta Pi pledges; a Delta Pi pledge must be primarily a man and his athletic ability, scholarship, or personal prowess is a secondary consideration.

The founders of the Delta Pi Fraternity were: C. C. Herrmann, F. M. Bine and J. M. Talbot. The process of for-

metion continued through a period of six months, during which the search for men of the desired type was carried on. An organization could have been effected in a shorter time, but the founders were anxious that the men selected should conform to the principles laid down.

The Delta Pi Fraternity has distinctly assumed her place among the fraternities of the campus with considerable success in Varsity athletics, campus publications, campus politics, and intermural athletics. Hime members of Delta Pi Fraternity were elected to honorary organizations in the past year. She has had representation on the Varsity football squad, and is at present represented in Varsity track, freshman varsity footballand freshman varsity backetball. Brother Osborns holds the Conference record in the high jump.

The Delta Pi Fraternity at present owns all of her equipment and furnishings free of encumbrances, and has created a fund for the erection of a home.

STATEMENT OF DELTA PI FRATERNITY PRINCIPLES.

- i. First, and most important, is manhood in which we recognize a high degree of personal integrity, enthusiasm, loyalty, zeal, and sympathy with principles of Christianity.
- a. Scholarship. The acquisition of knowledge is the primary motive in attending an institution of higher learning.

 Delta pi Fraternity therefore encourages and emphasizes this phase of attainment. This does not necessarily imply a high average but mental improvement is considered the measure of a man.
- 3. Activities. Delta Pi Fraternity encourages her every member to engage in some University activity for which he is best fitted.
- 4. The University of Illinois receives first consideration always but unquestionable loyalty to Delta Pi is not considered incompatible with this endeavor.
- 5. The constitution of Delta Pi specifically states that fratermity membership should not be a cause for snobbishness.

In this prayer Delta Pi Fraternity has included a brief history of the University of Illinois, of the org mination of Delta Pi, a history of the achievements of her present active members, and a statement of the principles upon which the fraternity is founded.
