CONSTITUTION OF EPSILON OMEGA ALPHA FRATERNITY OF LOCK HAVEN S.T.C.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this Fraternal organization shall be Epsilon Omega Alpha.

ARTICLE II

Principle and Purpose

Sec. I The principle of this Fraternal organization shall be that indicated by the Greek phrase for which the name stands.

Sec. II The purpose of this organization shall be to uphold the standards of Epsilon Omega Alpha, to encourage members to strive to attain its ideals, achieve its purposes and bind together its membership.

ARTICLE III

Membership

Sec. I The character, ability, and willingness to support the Fraternity and its principles shall be the basis of eligibility to membership.

Sec. II A member will no longer be considered in good standing if shall miss a total of three out of nine meetings, unless some extenuating circumstance prevails.

Sec. III A Brother will no longer be considered in good standing if he shall have failed to pay his dues as set by this Fraternal organization.

Sec. IV No man belonging to any other Fraternity is eligible for membership. The term Fraternity shall not be interpreted to include Honorary and professions societies.

Sec. V Honorary membership may be extended to any person in recognition of outstanding achievement with the approval of the Executive Committee.

Sec. VI No person with less than a "C" average will be considered for Brotherhood.

Sec. VII Any man put on probation by the College is automatically put on probation by this Fraternity.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

Sec. I Officers of the Fraternity shall consist of a President, a Vice president, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Student Council Representative and a Facility Advisor. They will be elected by a majority of the Brothers present at the meeting designated for annual election. A quorum will be necessary, however.

Sec. II The President of the Fraternity shall be the chief executive officer, and will preside over all meetings. He shall appoint all committee chairmen and members.

Sec. III The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in his absence, or in his inability to act. He shall succeed to the presidency in the event of the death or resignation of the president.

Sec. IV The Secretary shall be the custodian of the Constitution, Bylaws, Rituals, Records, and Archives of the Fraternity. He shall keep an accurate record of the meeting procedure and also sign all membership certificates.

Sec. V The Treasurer shall collect dues and maintain all financial affairs of the Fraternity. He shall propose an annual statement authorizing financial activity of the Fraternity of the past year. Financial activity is subject to an annual audit by a committee, as appointed by the President.

Sec. VI The Student Council Representative shall attend all Student Council meetings as a representative of this Fraternity and make regular reports to this Fraternity.

Sec. VII The Facility Advisor shall advise us.

SSec. VIII The Executive committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer Student Council Representative, and a Facility Advisor.

ARTICLE V

Meetings and Voting

Sec. I The number, type, time, and place of meetings shall be determined by the voting members of this Fraternity.

Sec. II Only those members shall vote who are in good standing in the Fraternity.

Sec. III A special meeting can be called by the Executive committee.

Sec. IV Officers shall be elected at the annual meeting at the begining of the fiscal year. They will go into office the following September when school starts.

Sec V. All meetings shall be conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE VI

A Quorum

Sec. I A quorum necessary to carry on the business of the Fraternity in any meeting shall consist of one more than half the total number of active members in good standing for the current year.

ARTICLE VII

Fiscal Year

Sec. I The fiscal year of this Fraternity shall be the calender year March the first through the last day of February, and financial summaries shall be based on transactions within this period.

ARTICLE VIII

Finances

Sec. I A committee consisting of at least one member of the Executive Committee and four members of the Fraternity shall set the initiate and membership fees. This committee shall be appointed by the President at a regular or special meeting.

Sec. II The dead-line for dues payable will be the second regular meeting of each semester. Anyone failing to meet these dues requirements is automatically dropped from pledgeship or membership of this Fraternity.

ARTICLE IX

Conduct

Sec. I Brothers and Pledges of this Fraternity shall conduct themselves at all times as befits gentlemen.

Sec. II Brothers and Pledges of this Fraternity shall observe the regulations of Lock Haven State Teachers College and at all times avoid intemperate conduct which would injure the reputation of this Fraternity and College.

Sec. III Public informal initiations by this Fraternity are forbidden.

Sec. IV No informal initiation of this Fraternity shall consist of anything obscene, immoral, or endangering the health of the initiate.

ARTICLE X

Amendments

Sec. I Any amendment must be submitted in writing to the President. It will be the Presidents duty to bring such an amendment to the attention of the Brothers of this Fraternity at the meeting immediately following the receipt of the proposed amendment.

Sec. II A two-thirds majority of those Brothers present is necessary to pass an amendment, but those present must constitute a quorum.

Sec. III The standing amendment shall be circulated at least thirty one days after it was introduced before it can be voted upon.

ARTICLE XI

Effectiveness

Sec. I This Constitution shall become effective as of April 30, 1957. forward and forevermore.
