Established as a land-grant University in 1867 as a result of the Morrill Act of 1865, West Virginia University has grown to be a major regional teaching and research center. West Virginia University is made up of 17 major academic divisions ranging from social work to journalism to engineering to law. WVU offers over 175 degree programs and has students from all 50 states and over 20 different countries. WVU has sent 23 Rhodes Scholars to Oxford, England to study abroad, the third highest total among Division I-A schools. WVU's two separate campuses are connected by the PRT, or Personal Rapid Transit, which is a driverless tramway system. The computer guided cars drive along 8.7 miles of raised glide way.

WVU began as a men only agricultural and engineering college but accepted its first women in the year 1889. WVU's band used to be a military style band until the mid-70s when it was opened up to any student qualified to march. Since then it has gained national acclaim and is one of the best in the nation. WVU's athletic programs are also just as strong. The rifle team has won four consecutive NCAA championships and has won 6 of the last 7. The football team challenged for the national championship in the Fiesta Bowl in 1988. The basketball team has had great success in the past and present, making the NCAA tournament last in 1988. WVU has great tradition in the Mountaineer and with over 5 buildings on the National Register of Historical Places. WVU is a high-quality

institution further enhanced by the addition of Kappa Delta Rho Fraternity in 1991.

A Brief History of Mu Alpha Provisional

Chapter of Kappa Delta Rho

Mu Alpha (provisional) began in December of 1989 with the meeting of a few outgoing, enthusiastic men with the foresight to see what a chapter could become in the future. With the goal of acquiring a charter from the national office and of becoming an integral member of West Virginia University's Greek community, the initial members decided on an aggressive membership recruitment campaign to commence in January of 1990. The recruitment campaign was successful and membership grew quickly to over 40 members. With the large membership, our influence began to increase on campus. A mildly successful "Dude Auction" netted a small, but important, donation to the Ronald McDonald House in Morgantown. A respectable 3rd Place showing in the Greek Week capped the first semester of Kappa Delta Rho on WVU's campus.

The summer of 1990 was not kind to the chapter. Transfers and financial troubles contributed to a returning membership of just over 30 members. The returning members, however, quickly started where the last semester left off. The chapter simply recruited new, better members to replace those not returning and those who got discouraged and resigned their membership. The chapter was

socially active again with the West Virginia tradition of tailgating before football games. The chapter ended the fall semester with 32 members.

The break between semesters again was not kind to the chapter. Membership dropped to 22 members with transfers, drops and financial troubles taking their toll. But with the chartering in sight, a rejuvenated social schedule and the timely and appreciated help of the national office, the chapter is again launching an aggressive recruitment program designed to obtain the numbers of quality, outstanding men who have come to represent the Kappa Delta Rho gentleman.

By the fall of 1991 membership dropped to 19 members with two old members returning to the fold. Great expectations about fall rush had the fraternity abuzz with anticipation; all brothers wanted rush to be successful. Fall rush did extremely well as the provisional chapter doubled in size with a pledge class of 19 men. The brothers were ecstatic with the number and quality of the pledges. The existing brothers and pledges have dedicated this fall to the goal of obtaining the charter from the National Office and are having fun pursuing that goal.

WEEK I

- Junior Tribune begins by giving some information about himself. (Major, interests, hobbies, hometown, ect..)
- Junior Tribune introduces members of the pledge committee. Each member of the pledge committee tells a little about themselves.
- Junior Tribune asks each pledge to tell a little bit about themselves so everyone can become acquainted with each other.
- Each pledge will receive a specific pad and specific pen in which they will keep all their required information pertaining to the fraternity.
- Explain the principle of a big brother and the role they play through out the pledge program.
- Explain the concept of brotherhood, loyalty, honesty, trustworthiness, and honor. This is very important and should be fully elaborated.

- Explain the credit hour system of 110 hours.
- Explain the match game.
- Have pledges elect pledge officers: Pres, VP, Sect., Tres., Social.
- Have the pledges turn in a list of there course schedules.
- Have pledges fill out a form with all pertinent information on it, including phone number.
- Inform pledges of there scholastic requirements.
- Conclude by congratulating pledges on a fine choice by joining KDR.

WEEK II

- All bothers present. Each brother tells a little about himself. Pledges write down the information into specified pad with specifies pen.
- Actives leave.
- GUEST SPEAKER -Introduce consul to explain duties and responsibilities of his office. Then the Housing Chairman explains his duties.
- Explain the paddle system along with the signatures and how the pledges are to go about obtaining them. Tell them to start obtaining them as soon as possible.
- Give the pledges more material to study from the study guide. Warn them that they will have a quiz next meeting.
- Tell the pledges to start thinking of their pledge fund raiser program.
- Start the mandatory study time and house cleaning hours.
- Recommend that the pledge class try to set up a mixer with a sorority pledge class (if applicable).
- Take the selections of the pledges choice for big brother.

- Talk about brotherhood, loyalty, secrecy, and honor.
- Plan activity for brothers and pledges for the following week.

WEEK III

- GUEST SPEAKER - Treasurer talks about his position and the duties. He gives a brief talk about what it takes to run a successful chapter, how the money is allocated, and the personal financial responsibility.
- Treasurer leaves.
- Quiz I on pathfinder material.
- Assign big brothers. Explain the BB-LB relationship and the responsibility of each to each other.
- Discuss the credits up to date.
- Discuss possible bonus credit hours.
- Discuss the importance of unity among the pledge class.

WEEK IV

- GUEST SPEAKER - Secretary - discuss his duties.
- Secretary leaves.
- Return graded quizzes (I).
- Assign new materials for next week. (Fraternity Structure).
- Have pledge- executive board report on pledge class progress. (Mixers, fund raisers, ect..)
- Plan to invite guest speaker from nationals to come down and talk to the pledge class.
- Have pledge study the 'KDR Gentlemen'.
- Review pledge pads.

WEEK V

- GUEST SPEAKER - Greek Advisor -(Ron Justice) Have him talk about hazing and the drinking policies.
- Greek advisor leaves.
- Quiz and assign new material.
- Remind them to continue getting information and signatures of brothers for their paddles.
- Pledge executive board reports
- Review credit hours (study time, house cleaning, bonus ect..)
- End the meeting with a discussion on proper studying habits.

WEEK VI

- GUEST SPEAKER - Social chairman talks about his duties.
- Social chairman leaves.
- Return quizzes and comment.
- Give quiz and assign material for last quiz.
- Pledge executive committee gives report.
- Tell pledges to finish up with their paddles.
- Review credit hours and push those who are behind.
- Assign essay : Why do I want to be a KDR? What do I want and what can I do for my Fraternity?
- Have them study Parliamentary Procedure and the National Constitution/By-laws.
- Pledge gripe session. Have pledge unleash all complaints. Note them down for future reference.

- Conclude with small speech and congratulations.

BYLAWS OF THE
MU ALPHA (provisional) CHAPTER OF
KAPPA DELTA RHO FRATERNITY

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this fraternity shall be MU ALPHA (provisional) Chapter of National Fraternity of Kappa Delta Rho.

ARTICLE II PURPOSES

The purpose of the Fraternity shall be the promotion of good fellowship among its members and the advancement of truth, justice and virtue. The fraternity shall provide a source of identity and, if responsibly led, a source of dignity for every member. The fraternity will be a significant force in preparing its members for the challenges of the complex life they must face. The fraternity clearly recognizes the need for scholastic achievement, intellectual honesty, community service, personal and group fiscal responsibility. Mu Alpha provisional chapter accepts the opportunity of contributing to the general education of its members.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. The membership of this Fraternity shall consist of honorary members, alumni, actives, and pledges.

Section 2. Honorary members shall consist of outstanding faculty members or other men of good repute elected by the active chapter, and approved by the National Chapter.

Section 3. Alumni shall consist of those actives of the Fraternity who shall have completed their work at West Virginia University or those actives who, due to personal reasons terminated their career prior to graduation.

Section 4. Actives shall consist of undergraduates, fully initiated upon completion of all requirements set by the Fraternity and College.

Section 5. Pledges. Prospective members awaiting completion of the requirements for initiation.

Section 6. The voting membership shall consist of full-time West Virginia University students within Mu Alpha Provisional Chapter only.

Section 7. Mu Alpha Provisional Chapter shall not deny membership on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, political affiliation, handicap, or age.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

Section 1. President: The presiding officer of the Chapter. He presides at all meetings, enforces the laws, and serves in the capacity of general administrator. He makes all appointments to all committees with the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 2. First Vice-President: He is the Rush Chairman and assumes the duties of the President in his absence or incapacity. He will fill the position of President should the present President not be able to complete his elected term.

Section 3. Second Vice-President: He has full responsibility for all pledges and directs the pledge training program. He supervises the testing of pledges on the material required. He serves in the capacity of the First Vice-President in his absence.

Section 4. Secretary: He is the recording secretary of the Fraternity. He conducts all correspondence and keeps the minutes of all meetings in a permanent form. He maintains all initiation forms and the Bylaws.

Section 5. Treasurer: He collects all fees and pays all bills, keeping accurate records of all money received and disburses. He shall be responsible for preparing a budget for the forthcoming year subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 6. Sergeant at Arms. The doorkeeper of the Fraternal meetings. He receives the handclasp of all initiates before their admission to Fraternity meetings. He maintains all ritual equipment and maintenance of the meeting room.

Section 7. Chaplain: Chaplain of the Fraternity. He has charge of all devotional exercises on which the Fraternity participates. Responsible for the Invocation before all Fraternity meetings.

Section 8. Housemanager: He will be responsible for the care, upkeep, and cleanliness of the Chapter House or the Chapter room as the case may be.

Section 9. IFC Representative: He is the official representative of the Fraternity at all Interfraternity Council meetings.

Section 10. Executive Committee: This shall consist of President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. The committee prepares the agenda for all meetings and deals with all special problems as they arise. The Executive Council will also assist the President in his appointments of the Social Chairman, Social Service Chairman, Intramural Chairman, Scholarship Chairman, and their committee members. They shall appoint other committees as the needs arise.

ARTICLE V ELECTIONS

Section 1. Elections will be conducted the week prior to Thanksgiving Break in the fall semester. Nominations will be made during the Fraternity meeting prior to the elections. All nominations for all elected positions will remain open until the elections commence. All members nominated must be in good financial standing with the Fraternity. Upon completion of the elections, the President and Executive Committee shall meet to make appointments. The new President will copreside with the old President at the next meeting.

Section 2. At the time of the election the nominee must have a 2.0 GPA and must be a full-time West Virginia University student. Once elected the officer must maintain a 2.0 GPA or they will be removed from office.

ARTICLE VI MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Section 1. Pledges: To become a pledge, each upperclassman to be considered must have a 2.0 GPA. Freshman requirements will follow those set by the IFC. All rushees must be approved by a vote of the actives of the Fraternity to become pledges by receiving no more than 3 negative votes. Although the rushee did not receive a bid as a result of the first voting, the Rush Chairman may present his name before the actives for another vote. Should the rushee again not receive a favorable vote, his name will be retired from the Fraternity's list of rushees.

Section 2. Actives: To become initiated as a full member of the Fraternity, each pledge must complete all requirements set by the National Fraternity, the Chapter, and the local IFC; have completed all financial requirements; and receive no more than 1/3 negative votes from the active membership prior to the initiation.

ARTICLE VII FINANCES

Section 1. All financial requirements set by the Fraternity upon its membership shall be purposed by the Executive Committee and approved by vote of the active membership.

Section 2. The treasurer will prepare a budget of income and expenses which must be approved by vote of the active membership.

ARTICLE VIII MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of the active Fraternity shall be held every Monday beginning at 6:00 pm. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

Section 2. At all regular meetings a simple majority will be required to conduct any business.

Section 3. Permission may be given by the President to any active member to be absent from a meeting providing it is a legitimate reason (class, illness, or other emergency.)

Section 4. Any member being absent from a meeting without permission shall be fined five dollars.

Section 5. The secretary will call roll upon the President opening the meeting.

ARTICLE IX RUSH

Section 1. Because of the importance of all rushing functions, all members will be required to attend. All members means actives and pledges. Those absent without valid excuse will be fined twenty-five dollars.

ARTICLE X SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Section 1. The Fraternity shall adhere to the West Virginia Code of Student's Rights and Responsibilities.

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These Bylaws may be amended by a three-quarters vote of all members at a regular meeting. The purpose of the proposed amendment having been presented one meeting prior to its call for approval.

ARTICLE XII REMOVAL FROM OFFICE

Section 1. Any officer may be removed from office by a 2/3 vote of the active membership at any regularly scheduled meeting.

Section 2. The proposal shall be announced one meeting prior to the vote.
