PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE CONSTITUTION OF KAPPA DELTA RHO

(Chapter Consuls and Alumni Organization Officers are hereby instructed to advise their groups of the following legislation and to hold the meetings necessary to ascertain the wishes of their groups in order that their official delegates may be instructed to cast the proper votes in behalf of the groups they represent.

This notice will serve as official notice of proposed amendments to the National Constitution to be acted upon by the Annual Convention, July 16, 17, in Chicago.)

Art. III, Sect. 8

(Delete white, gentile in first sentence so that the first sentence will read:)

The members of a Chapter shall be male students in attendance at the institution at which the Chapter is located."

Art. VIII, Sect. 3

(Insert "even year" to read as follows:)

In the event of a vacancy in the office of any Director, the Board of Directors, by a majority vote of those present at any authorized meeting, may fill the vacancy until the next even year Convention which shall then elect a Director to fill the unexpired term.

Art. VIII, Sect. 4

(Revise to read as follows:)

Only alumni and honorary members shall be eligible for election as Directors. At each even year Convention three alternate directors shall be elected for a term of two years to serve in place of any director who is unable to attend meetings. Such alternates shall attend all Directors' Meetings but shall have no voting power except when a full board is not present in which event the alternates present shall, in the order of their election, fill the vacancies caused by the absence of directors. An alternate director filling a vacancy shall be entitled to full voting privileges.

Art. IX, Sect. 9

There shall be a Senior Alumni Council, the members of which shall be available for advice and counsel and for such special services as may be assigned to them by the current National Officers. All past Directors and Officers shall automatically become members of the Senior Alumni Council. A Senior Alumni Councilor present at any National Convention or Directors' Meeting shall be entitled to the courtesy of the floor but shall have no vote except as a proxy.

Art. X, Sect. 1 - Executive Secretary and Editor.

(Revise to read as follows:)

The Board of Directors shall appoint an Executive Secretary of the Fraternity who shall have charge of the executive offices of the Fraternity. He shall provide for the notices of the annual Convention, and shall attend to the keeping of the minutes thereof in permanent form, and shall send copies of such minutes to the various Chapters, Alumni Corporations, and Alumni Associations, and to the Board of Directors, and shall publish such minutes or suitable excerpts therefrom in the Fraternity magazine. He shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in permanent form. He shall be the custodian of the secret grip and password and opening order of the Chapter meeting and shall present them to each new

Art. X, Sect. 1 (Continued)

Chapter. He shall visit and inspect the various Chapters as often as may seem necessary and shall, in general, endeavor to keep in active touch with the affairs of the Fraternity.

Art. X, Sect. 2

The Board of Directors shall appoint an Editor of the Fraternity magazine, The Quill and Scroll of Kappa Delta Rho, who shall have charge of the publication of the magazine and the care of its circulation list and who shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him. Nothing herein, however, shall prevent the Directors from appointing the same person to perform the duties of Executive Secretary and Editor.

Art. X, Sect. 3

The Executive Secretary and Editor each shall be entitled to receive such reasonable salary and expenses as may be fixed by the Board of Directors for his services.

x Amendment to By-Laws

"The Board of Directors shall appoint a Special Secretary for the Fraternity whose duties shall be to keep in close contact with the other National Fraternities as to the possibilities of assimilation by Kappa Delta Rho, in whole or in part; and to keep in close contact with local fraternities on various campuses who are interested in joining a National Fraternity and who may possibly be initiated as new chapters of Kappa Delta Rho, if they are so approved. He shall make a report of his findings to the Board of Directors at stated intervals and he shall take personal charge of any business between the group in question and Kappa Delta Rho."

KAPPA DELTA RHO FRATERNITY - TREASURER'S REPORT - MARCH 31, 1948
Income and expense statement - July 1, 1947 thru March 31, 1948

REMARKS:

1. Income and expense: As indicated, alumni response has already exceeded the conservative forecast. However, this income and the Trust Fund income together will fall short of meeting publications expense, since full Trust Fund income for the year is reported, whereas two more issues of Q&S at about \$500 each are yet to be charged.

ACTIVE CHAPTER

DUES are behind forecast because (1) 2 chapters have not yet paid first semester dues, and (2) only 2 have paid second semester dues. In spite of great care on the part of your officers, nearly all expense items will probably exceed the budget forecast, labor and material costs being what they are.

2. BALANCE SHEET:

This shows clearly that, in order to meet current expenses, we are still borrowing from the authorized Cash

Reserve Fund and from money we owe the Quill and Scroll Trust Fund. This situation must be remedied before we have any basis for considering ourselves in a sound financial condition. \$2.00 alumni dues from the 3500 alumni who have not yet heeded the call this year could change the picture completely. Are you one of the 415 included in the above report? Or one of the 3500 excluded?
