

Annual Alumni Fund
Report

From The Past—1983/84



The 1983/84 school year for our fraternity has ended and the results show continued success. The Annual Alumni Fund Drive has reached a new high with the average contribution increased to \$30.55 as compared to \$28.23 from the 1982/83

Drive. As the Alumni support continues to grow, it is interesting to note that 58.2% of this year's revenues came directly from undergraduate fees, while this support is only approximately 7.5% of the active membership.

- Of the 1,057 alumni contributing, 756 or 72% of those were from the top ten contributing chapters.
- Those 756 contributing alumni gave 77% of the total dollars given.
- Contributions from the top ten chapters were generated from 11.4% of their living alumni.
- The 1,057 alumni contributing represent only 9.3% of our total living alumni.

The cost of an undergraduate degree today is percentage wise much higher than ever before. Undergraduates today are finding it increasingly difficult to meet the additional costs of joining a fraternity. To keep pledge and initiation fees down, we must look to other alternatives of funding for our programs. Alumni, as the above statistics support, are our greatest untapped funding resource. If an additional 10% of those who have never given in the past were to contribute in this fiscal year the average gift of \$30.55 each, and those presently giving in 83/84 remained the same, our total Alumni Fund Drive would reach \$63,507. Where are those 1,031 loyal alumni??



How has your contribution affected the progress of Kappa Delta Rho this past year? Included in this issue of the Quill & Scroll, an accomplishment report for the 80's is shown. However, highlights for this year were the chartering of Omicron


Alpha at Rutgers University and Pi Alpha at the University of Toledo. Provisional Chapters were established at Bryant College, Rhode Island, and Hofstra University, Long Island, New York, with seven registered Groups of Intent. Seven groups awaiting local administrative approval, etc., should be Provisional Chapters this fall, with hopes that several will meet the standards necessary to be chartered in the spring. This group includes the rechartering of our Delta Chapter at Colgate University and Alpha Alpha at Lock Haven University and Mu at the University of Michigan. The other groups include University of Delaware, Radford University, Parks College; Shepherd College, and California State University at Chico.

Along with a Midwest Conclave, chapter visitations were made to every chapter, Provisional chapters, etc., while some received two or more, due to necessity. Continued efforts were made to establish Area Alumni Clubs, while three chapter Alumni Corporations were established. Several support manuals were edited in an effort to give our undergraduates much needed guidance.


Also, in our efforts to increase our support efforts, our Headquarter's Staff was increased. Vince Thompson, Eta '83, became our Director of Chapter Services, and Mrs. Peg Zimmerman was appointed Director of Alumni Services. It was through their efforts that we were able to continue and upgrade our present and added programs.

All this would not have been possible without your continued interest and financial support.

This concept of "Unity Leads To Success," because of our present dedication to growth, is more important now than ever before. What is the reasoning behind this statement?





INCREASES IN CHAPTER SERVICES BY DOLLARS






